Electronic medication chart

Digital health systems such as electronic medication management (EMM) can improve the safety and quality of health care.

By using EMM, healthcare services can reduce the number of preventable adverse medication events, and medication prescribing and dispensing errors. EMM systems can improve the accuracy, visibility and legibility of medical information, so that the communication between professionals and consumers is clearer. AAC has invested in this upgrade and our Medical officers will now attend to medication ordering electronically. The pharmacy also has access to attend to dispensing of medications.



Fire

The positive feedback received in the last few months is inclusive of:


- "The meals are very nice"
